Saluda County Spay/Neuter Program Scheduling Requirements

To schedule your pet for the Saluda County Spay/Neuter Transport, please contact Kristie Long at (864)445-4500 x2351 or email spayneuter@saludacounty.sc.gov

- You MUST be a Saluda County resident to use this service.
- All paperwork is due at the time of scheduling.
 - You may take the forms with you, or request them to be emailed to you, but you will not be scheduled until the forms are completed and turned in.
- Full payment is due at the time of scheduling.
 - Fees are non-refundable if your appointment is not canceled or rescheduled by 5pm the Thursday prior to surgery.
- Current rabies certificate must be presented at the time of scheduling.
 - If you do not show proof of rabies vaccine at the time of scheduling, your pet will be required to receive a rabies vaccine at Pawmetto Lifeline on the day of surgery. Rabies tags are not accepted as proof of vaccination.
- If your pet is 7 years old or older, you will need to have a senior blood panel completed prior to scheduling.
 - You will need to present those results at the time of scheduling.
- Pets are required to be in carriers for transport.
 - Cats must be in hard, plastic carriers when they arrive for transport. If you need to borrow a
 carrier from Saluda County Animal Control, please let us know that at the time of scheduling.
 Please line cat carriers with a puppy pee pad.
 - One cat per carrier
 - Dogs should be in a hard, plastic carrier. If you must use a wire crate, please bring a sheet to cover the crate for transport. If you need to borrow a carrier, please let us know at the time of scheduling.
 - One dog per carrier
- Feral cats must be in a size appropriate trap for transport.
 - No feral cats in regular carriers
 - One feral cat per trap
